PARTY IN THE PARK



THE 'READY' RACER

- Bibs on front and back, numbers are unobstructed
- LED vest with lights on; fresh batteries
- Timing chip on left arm or on front of vest
- Ideally, no ear buds or headphones
- Leg 3 runner carries passport



RACE SAFETY

ON THE ROAD

SUPPORT VEHICLE SAFETY

- Vehicles CANNOT shadow or pace a racer.
- B checkpoints - no parking opposite the CP, park past it preferably
- Vehicles are NOT ALLOWED TO STOP in any highway lane.
 - South Klondike Highway - Vehicles may pull over completely ON THE SHOULDER
 - Alaska Highway - Vehicles may only pull over INTO A PULLOUT OR SIDE ROAD
- Miles Canyon Road is CLOSED TO ALL VEHICLES from 10am-5pm.
 - Support vehicles are to continue on Alaska Highway onto Robert Service Way.

AS RACE SUPPORT ALONG THE ROUTE, ENSURING ROAD SAFETY FOR RACERS IS AN IMPORTANT PART OF YOUR ROLE!



EMERGENCIES & HAZARDS

IDENTIFICATION & MANAGEMENT

IN CASE OF EMERGENCY

- **PROVIDE IMMEDIATE ASSISTANCE**
 - Canadian Ski Patrol Volunteers are available to assess / provide first aid.
- **SUMMON HELP**
 - If necessary, CALL 9-1-1 or ASK CHECKPOINT LEAD or YARA to contact emergency services.

COMMUNICATIONS

STARLINK / CELL SERVICE

- Every checkpoint will have access to either cell service or StarLink internet.
- There is **NO PUBLIC / VOLUNTEER ACCESS** to StarLink - it is for race timing and emergency communications only.

YARA

- There is a YARA volunteer at each checkpoint to help relay race communications, pass instructions from the Race Coordinator, and contact emergency services, if necessary.

WEBSITE / SOCIAL MEDIA

- As the broadest communication channel, we will use KRR social media and website to provide updates / announcements / emergency communications.

COURSE CONDITIONS

Skagway to CP2

- Race resumes State St. routing
- Reduce noise after 9 pm
- Run on right-hand side after bridge
- Torn up highway near quarry
- Rockfall mitigation project - Mile 4-6

CP4 to CP6

- Reminder for Leg 4 racers who submitted passport details
- Bitumen Surface Treatment (BST) sections = loose gravel

CP5

- No internet available this year

COURSE CONDITIONS

Carcross CP7

- Reduce noise until 8 am
- Highway crossing to run on left-hand side

CP10

- **MINIMAL** parking - plan to just drop off
- Gascard station and Food truck in operation
- Civil behaviour towards volunteers expected!
- **Mass Start**
 - Walkers: 2 pm
 - Runners: 3 pm

CP10b

- Highway crossing to Miles Canyon Road
- MC Road is unsupported
- Bicycle patrol for safety
- No pulling in at Yukon Energy

ALASKA HIGHWAY

- Checkpoint 10 (Carcross Cutoff)
- Alaska Highway
- Checkpoint 10b

RACE RULES

CHECKPOINT OPENING / CLOSING

- Opening and Closing times are **FIRM** - **no early or late racers.**
- Racers cannot leave until their teammate and their timing tag have arrived at the checkpoint.
 - **EXCEPTION** - CP10 Mass Start - 2 pm for walkers, 3 pm for runners

OTHER ISSUES

- No group running
- Costumes must be safe - don't restrict visibility nor hearing. Bib & LED vests must be visible



TIMING & RESULTS

TIMING TAGS

- Attached to bib or left arm/wrist
- Passed to next racer before they can leave
- Teams should track arrival times on BLUE TIMING SHEET

WITHDRAWALS and SUBSTITUTIONS

- Must be reported to CP managers/timers as soon as possible
- May result in penalties
- Team DNFs don't eliminate individual leg times from records

CP 10 MASS START

- For teams where a 5:30 pm finish is in doubt; 2 pm for walkers, 3 pm for runners
- Mass start runners will get a new timing tag for the Leg 10 racer

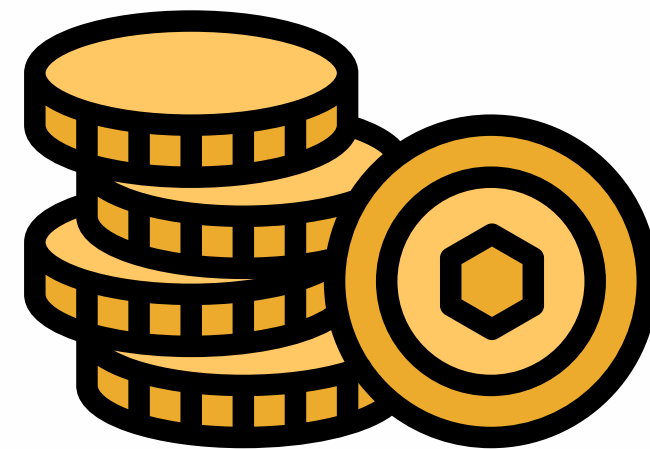
